Please remind your students that they will be at a school function, so school rules still apply. If your students are being dropped off by a parent then the teacher is responsible for that student. Either a teacher or parent should supervise any students that you bring to the competition at all times.

I. Schedule of the Day

7:30-8:15	Registration/Team Check In
7:30-8:45	Team Practice

9:00-1:00	Firefighting Simulation Challenge
1:00-2:00	Awards Ceremony

II. What to do when your team arrives:

1. Proceed directly to the **Registration Table** to get signed in and receive your **Registration Packet** for the day. Each team will have a table with electrical outlets nearby to plug in computers and to work on their robot. *You will need to provide your own extension cords and power strips.* Team Information Packets will include the following items: team number/name badges for each team member and coach, building map and the tournament schedule-at-a-glance sheet.
2. All participants must complete and turn-in a 2011-2012 Release form. See section IX.

III. Needs and Reminders for the Day:

1. **Remember Your Tournament Team Number** – All teams will receive a Tournament Team Number at the registration table. Your Team Number determines the time you are scheduled for your Firefighting matches. By looking at your **Tournament Team Number** and the Tournament Schedule-at-a-Glance sheet, you can determine when your team must report and to which location.
2. Each team will be provided several **Tournament Schedule-at-a-Glance** sheets during registration, which you may use to aid your team members in remembering your schedule. Extra copies will be available at the registration table.
3. Due to the nature of the Competition areas, **contestants and coaches MUST wear tennis shoes or non-scuff shoes.** We must be courteous to Bossier City hosts by helping them maintain the civic center floor.
4. **Competition Area Guidelines – IMPORTANT:** No adults can approach the competition area AT ANY TIME (immediately preceding, during, or after competition play). *Only two team members at a time are allowed to be on the playing field located within the competition area. Only team captains can speak with the judges.* The rest of the team and coach(es) must remain behind the line to cheer on their team. This is done so that the maximum amount of spectators can see the event(s).
5. **Time Guidelines** for all Competition Sessions – It is very important that all teams maintain the schedule to ensure a timely tournament. Refer to your Tournament Schedule-at-a-Glance sheet and your Tournament Team Number to see the location and time when your team is to report for competition.
6. **WARNING: Interference**

NXT & Boe-Bot Robots – There are no guarantees that you won't encounter ultrasonic interference from other sources, including other robots with the use of the ultra sonic

sensor(s). Thus, there is an implicit risk involved. We are limiting the numbers of students per team next to the competition table but if both robots at the table are using ultrasonics, we do not know how many problems they may encounter.

IV. **Calibrating Your Robot**

Teams can use the competition tables before/after each round to calibrate their light sensors. **No calibration will be allowed while a match/run is being completed.**

V. **Setup, Pit Area and Practice Area:**

1. **TEAM Setup & Pit Area** –Each school will have a table with electricity to plug in computers and to work on its robot. Practice boards will be available for teams to use prior to the competition. **Teams should not bring their own practice boards to the event.** All personal items can be stored under your table, but please be aware that we are not responsible for lost or stolen items. **Please bring extra batteries and a power extension cord(s) for your computer.** We will not provide extension cords. Tables will have the school name on them.

VI. **Additional Information:**

1. **Protests** – Please keep in mind that this is an educational, fun event and that the coach is the model for the team members. Remember that the judge makes all field judgment calls and cannot consider protests. Lead Judge decisions are final.
2. **Concessions** – There is a concession stand available at the Bossier Civic Center. More details regarding the menu at the concession stand will follow.
3. **Information regarding NXT users** – **MATERIALS:** At the competition table, the robot, its attachments, and all strategic objects must be made entirely of LEGO® elements in original factory condition. Objects that function as remote controls are **not allowed anywhere.** There are no restrictions on the quantity, but the LEGO® pieces must be in their original factory condition except for normal wear. Stickers, paint, tape, glue, oil, etc. are not allowed, except markers may be used for owner identification in hidden areas only. To participate in a match, a team must follow this rule.

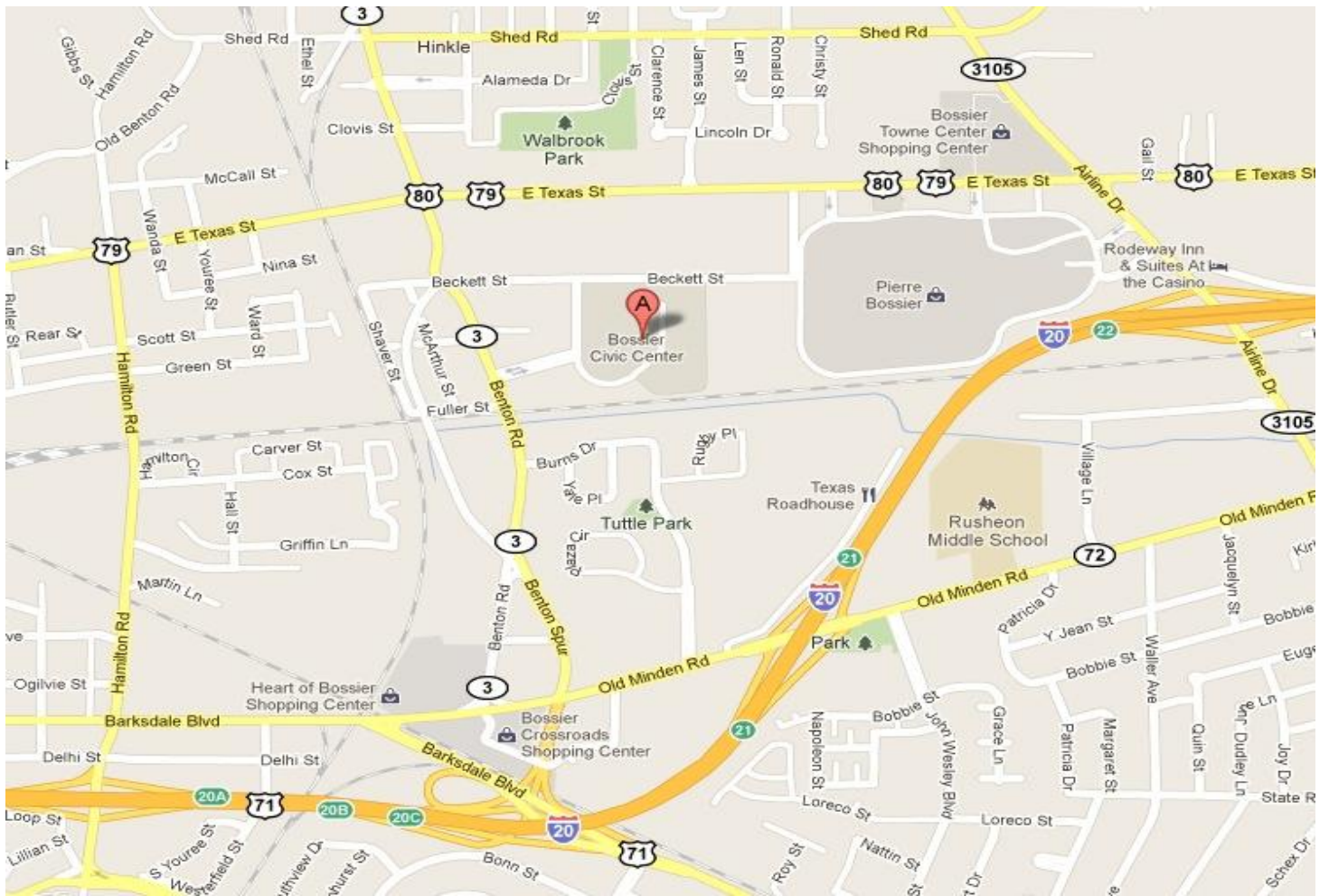

VIII. Coach/Team Checklist:

The following list is being provided to help make your experience a positive one and to help you to organize your day. You can use the blank lined areas to list your own ideas. Check off the areas as you complete them.

- Due to the nature of the competition areas, contestants and coaches **MUST** wear tennis shoes or non-scuff shoes. We must be courteous to our Bossier City hosts in helping them maintain the Civic Center floors.
- Bring a "Release Form" for each team member, mentor and coach(es). *(YES, you need one, too)*
- Bring extension cords and power strips.
- Bring laptops.
- Bring a copy of the computer software you used (i.e. LEGO® MindStorms v2.0, etc.).
- It would be wise to bring your programs backed up on a disk/data stick in case of emergency.
- Bring extra batteries.
- Bring copy paper box or shoebox to store/put your robot in to help protect it from being accidentally reprogrammed or interfered with. It will also help you transport it from place to place.
- Do not bring team competition boards to the event.
- Download a map on how to get to Bossier Civic Center.
- 'Morning of' reminders:
 - o Make sure you get/know your Team Tournament Number(s).
 - o Make sure everyone is wearing Tennis Shoes/non-scuff shoes.

IX. 2011-12 CONSENT, RELEASE, HOLD HARMLESS AND AUTHORIZATION TO REPRODUCE PHYSICAL LIKENESS
